6th graders may turnout for practice, but are unable to compete in the meets. All sports fees paid and physicals completed in order to practice.






# Library News


Chehalis School District students that are currently identified as a Highly Capable student <u>do not</u> need to be tested again.

### Information from Todd Thornburg, Chehalis School District Security and Safety Officer

BeReal is an app that encourages users to share an unedited photo once per pay in response to a push message. The user's friends also receive the same notification, prompting the group to take a photo of what they are currently experiencing at the time.

When users receive an alert, they have up to 2 minutes to share the photo and may then view the images their friends have already uploaded. The software is straightforward to use, recording a selfie and a front-facing shot simultaneously.

#### **What Parents Should Know**

\*In-App Communication

\*Inappropriate Content Can Still Be Shared

\*Parental Controls

- \*Photo Sharing
- \*The BeReal app does not feature parent controls
- \*Location Information Can Be Shared
- \*Once you react to an image with an emoji, you can now comment back and forth
- \*Spontaneous photos are taken of whatever the user wants to share this could be obviously be exploited by those with bad intentions.
- \*Geo-location is enabled by default.

#### **Potential Problems**

#### **Negative Reinforcement of App Usage**

If you miss the two minute time restriction for taking the shot, the user receives a message that they are "late". Negative reinforcement could lead children to prioritizing between the app and school.

#### **Consistent Documentation of Personal Nature**

The app encourages users to take "candid" images and videos of themselves, which means users are continually divulging their whereabouts, interests, and other possible personal facts. With no privacy features or blocking abilities, it is possible for strangers to observe your child or teen's posts and gain a more intimate knowledge of their day-by-day activities and whereabouts.

#### Recommendations

Use with caution for children 13 or older. Disable the geo-location tracking. Only add close friends or family members.

#### **Some Good Options for Parents**

#### Monitor, Alert, and Protect with Bark

• Where other app's safety and inappropriate content filters fail, you can utilize Bark!. The best parental control and notification app for mobile devices, monitoring your child's app activity has just become easier.

#### **Get the Pinwheel Phone**

Parent's ask, "what's a safe phone for my child? I don't want to worry about all the apps and headaches. I have found it in the Pinwheel smartphone! It gives the caregiver unprecedented levels of control over how their child's phone works. Easily enable/disable apps, control screen time, no unapproved calls, and monitor your child's conversations as they learn healthy communication. Deleted texts still show. The Parent portal provides deep insight into your child's internet safety.
