Here are some things to know for the new school year:

Love supporting your library? **Do both!!**


On November 20th students and staff are invited to pay \$1 to wear a hat for the day. This money goes directly to our library for the purchase of new books.

Attendance:

This year, the Chehalis School District is joining the rest of the state to focus on school attendance. Attending class regularly is the first step to school success, and it helps students feel better about school.

DID YOU KNOW?

- At any level, too many absences (excused and unexcused) can cause children to fall behind in school.
- Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) increases the chance that your student will fall behind in basic skills as compared to their peers.
- By 6th grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student may drop out of high school.
- State law requires children ages 8–17 to attend school or a district-approved home school program.

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

Encourage good habits at home, and make school a priority. Set a regular bedtime and morning routine. As much as possible, schedule appointments or trips for times when school is not in session.

Of course, sometimes, there are reasons for a child to stay home. If your child is too ill to come to school, please take care of them at home so other students can avoid getting sick. If your child does need to miss school, call our attendance line at 360-807-7230 to let us know or message us in Parent square. Keep track of your child's absences—it's easy for them to add up without realizing it.

Info and Rules

We are excited to have our 1st Social of the year! A few things to keep in mind:

WHO: Chehalis 6th, 7th, and 8th Graders Only! Students who have overdue library books, fines or have been suspended (ISS or OSS) are unable to attend.

COST: \$5.00 ~ \$3.00 with ASB sticker. Please prepay at the student store. Students with ID who prepay will be admitted FIRST, through an express entrance!!

WHERE: Chehalis Middle School

WHEN: FRIDAY, OCTOBER 11th from 3:00-5:00 PM

- Activities include game room, dancing/music, open gym and movie room.
- You may NOT bring drinks into the social from outside. Drinks and candy may be purchased from the school student store.
- Students will not be allowed to leave the building before 5:00 pm without a parent/guardian signature. Students must either bring a note on the day of the social or have parents sign them out at the early exit door. Without a note, students are not allowed to leave with parents/guardians of another student.
- All school rules are in effect.

DRESS CODE - School dress code applies, but hats ARE allowed

OTHER INFO:

- Students will enter and leave through the front doors or the Commons courtyard door (see above). The back, side, and gym doors are not to be opened.
- Bring extra money if you want to purchase candy or drinks while attending the social (\$1 per item).
- Students will remain inside the approved social areas. Students who leave the building are not allowed to come back in. Students who leave without permission will not be allowed to attend the next social.
- Students must arrive by 30 minutes after the social starts or will not be allowed in.
- Students MUST BE picked up within 20 minutes after the social has ended. Students who are not picked up on time will not be allowed to attend the next social.
- Backpacks will be checked in and can be retrieved at the end of the social.
- The hallways will be closed and students should not bring valuables.
- Unauthorized people on the premises will be referred to the authorities.
- All school rules and policies are applicable, students not abiding by school rules will call their parents to pick them up, will not be allowed to attend future socials, and may face disciplinary action.
