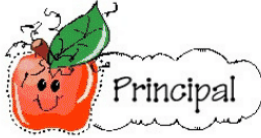

Let's talk about after school pick-up

We have noticed since school began that an increasing number of parents are parking or walking over to pick their student(s) up in front of the school. While this may seem more convenient and quicker to some, the increasing number of people is causing many folks to have to wait as long as they would have if they had used the car drive-thru for pick-up. This is due to the need to check each child out on the clipboard and to check ID when necessary.

Increased congestion in the area right in front of the school when staff are walking kids out to cars and to busses also creates a security issue because of the sheer number of people and children in that area. (For parents who choose to walk up, the waiting area must be alongside the building in front of the windows, not over by the bike rack or in the area where kids are coming out to busses or cars.)

In the interest of increasing student safety, we want to encourage as many of you as possible to use the car drive-thru for getting your student after school. We have developed a pretty efficient system for getting them to you as fast as possible. For those of you who live close by and want to walk over to pick your kids up, that's totally understandable of course!

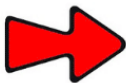


Checklist:

Always bring your ID when you come to check out your child. If the office staff doesn't know you, they will be checking ID.
Ensure that the office has current information of how to reach you. This is very important!
Make sure that your contact numbers are able to receive messages (voicemail box clear).
Emergency contacts: A common misunderstanding is that if a person is on your student's emergency list that they are automatically allowed to pick up your child. This is not the case! We must hear from the parent giving specific authorization for any student to be picked up who is not the parent or guardian.
Pick up for appointments: If your child has an appointment right after school, plan to be here by 2:25 to pick him/her up so you are able to get into the parking lot!

Title I Notification
Parents can request the following information regarding instructional staff who work with their children:

- Whether or not the child's teacher has met state certification for the grades and subjects she/he is teaching.
- Whether or not the teacher is working with an emergency or conditional certificate where state certification criteria has been waived.
- The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held, including field of discipline of the certificate or degree.
- If the child receives instructional services from a paraprofessor, the paraprofessor's qualifications.
