- KiK - KiK Messenger is a free instant messaging and social networking app.
- Parental Controls - None
- Rated 17+
- Recommend only using the messaging app that comes with the phone.


## - Problems

- Long history of predators using it to exploit children.
- Some features that made the app dangerous had been taken out.
- Chatting via text or video with strangers is still possible.
