Career & College Readiness



- **Financial Aid money** - If you haven't already, please complete your FAFSA or WASFA as soon as possible. It is an online application at www.fafsa.gov. This year, with the increased income cut-off for the Washington College Grant, more families can now get assistance for post-secondary education. However, to be eligible for this grant and others, you must complete the FAFSA/WASFA. If you or your families need any help in completing this form, please contact Mrs. Chaput.
- **TRADE School Tour** - On February 7th, we will be doing a college tour to Clover Park Technical College. Clover Park offers over 50 different programs including; Dental Assistant, Electrician Low Voltage Fire/Security, Culinary Arts, Construction Technology, Cosmetology, Aviation Maintenance, Automotive Technician & Collision, Cybersecurity, Computer Programing, Forklift Certification, Graphic Technologies, HVAC Technician, Interior Design, Nursing, Pilot, Surgical Technology, and many more. 1. You only need to fill out one application for both scholarships.
2. Once you begin, if you are not able to complete the entire application, you must still “submit” what you have completed in order to have it saved. You will then receive an email to the address you’ve provided. The email will contain a link for you to use to edit your application. You can make changes to your application at any time prior to **3:00 p.m. on February 28th**. Once you certify that your application is complete by clicking yes, and hit the submit button one last time, you will no longer be able to make changes.
3. Your application is NOT complete until you also provide a copy of your resume - we will provide a transcript.
4. Scholarship applications must be completed online by **3:00 p.m. on February 28th**.

Title I Notification

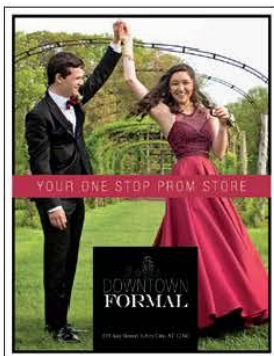
