Washington State Seal of Biliteracy

The Washington State Seal of Biliteracy was established to recognize public high school graduates who have attained a high level of proficiency in speaking, reading, and writing in one or more world languages in addition to English. "Participating school districts with students eligible to receive the Seal, shall place a notation on a student's high school diploma and high school transcript indicating that the student has earned the seal." (RCW 28A.300.575 / RCW 28A.230.125)

Graduating high school students must meet the following criteria to be awarded the Seal:

- Demonstrate proficiency in English by meeting the graduation requirements in English and meeting standard on reading and writing or English language arts assessments; and
- Demonstrate proficiency in one or more world languages.

We have scheduled two teacher conference days to give you the time to meet each teacher, discuss with each teacher your student's progress, and give you the information necessary to give support and encouragement at home. We truly believe that if teachers, parents and administrators work together, our students can achieve their maximum growth.

Conferences for all teachers will be held in the high school Commons. Parents will have a very short distance to walk to meet with all teachers. This should help shorten the total amount of time needed to meet with all teachers.

Entry to parent/teacher conferences is at the Commons doors. Parents will register there, pick up their student's schedule and a map of department locations. Parents are urged to confer with all teachers to discuss individual progress and mutual concerns. All teachers are isolated in an open-arena type setting and are available to meet with parents on a first-come basis. No prior appointments are necessary. We will have refreshments available.

Conference Q&A

Q: If I want to attend conferences should I call and make an appointment?
A: No. With arena-style conferences, you come when it is convenient for you to attend. Conferences occur on a first-come, first-served basis. If one teacher has parents already waiting, simply locate another teacher who is free.

Q: I want to attend a conference with one teacher. Do I have to go through a "big process" to accomplish that?A: If you want to spend the minimum amount of time conferencing, we suggest that you come at the very beginning or end of the conference session.

Q: I don't want to attend any conferences, but I do want to receive a progress report for my student.

A: Call the Counseling Center at 807-7235, Ext. 5514. The staff can help you with your request.

Q: I will probably need to talk with one teacher for more than 10 minutes. Does the 10 minute limit mean that I can't talk longer than that?

A: We make a real effort to limit conferences to no longer than 10 minutes so other parents don't have long waits, but you may schedule a longer conference by emailing the teacher or contacting the school to schedule a time.

Q: I have a very short amount of time available. Will I have to stand in long lines?
A: We have centralized the location for all conferences in the Commons area.
Because of the close proximity of this location, you can move easily between teacher conference areas. Our best estimate is that your total conference time should not exceed one and a half hours.

Q: How are arena-style conferences different from parent conferences in other schools?

A: We have no prior appointments and all teachers are located in one central area. Therefore, you can move freely between teachers. If one teacher has a longer waiting line, simply select another teacher whom you wish to talk with.

Q: I would like my student to attend parent/teacher conferences, but I would like to contact my student's teachers at some other time. What should I do?A: Email the teacher or contact the school to set up an appointment.



Important Food Service Information for All Families!



Dear Chehalis Food Service Customers,

All students who attend the following schools: James W. Lintott Elementary, Orin C. Smith Elementary, Chehalis Middle School and Turning Point Alternative School will receive Breakfast and Lunch at no charge throughout the 2022-23 school year. These schools fall under the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP), which is a program designed to provide free Breakfast and Lunch to each student without having to fill out a meal application. Under the CEP program, data is collected using a Family Income Survey. The Chehalis School District encourages families to fill out the Family Income Survey as funding for certain programs is driven by survey responses.

W.F. West High School does not fall under the CEP program and thus families will have to fill out a meal application in order to qualify for free or reduced meals at the high school. If a meal application is not on file by October 17, 2022, the student's meal eligibility status will revert/default to Paid status. Depression and suicide often coincide. Yet not everyone who is depressed attempts suicide – and not everyone who attempts suicide is depressed.

Not everyone exhibits the same signs that they're thinking about suicide, but these warning signs are cause for concern.



- Physical changes in appearance or hygiene.
- Increase in alcohol or drug use.
- Sudden drop in grades.
- Social withdrawal.
- Talking about suicide or preoccupation with death.
- Risky or reckless behaviors (such as reckless driving).
- Self-harm behaviors such as cutting.
- Talking about feeling hopeless or nothing to live for.
- Researching suicide methods and/or acquiring weapons.

Suicide is a difficult topic, but it's too important to ignore.
