Coffee Shop

Business & Marketing students will get hands-on training and skills through Crimson & Gray Coffee Shop opening in February

This February brings the opening of the much anticipated Crimson & Gray Coffee Shop powered by Lewis County Coffee. Students in Kristin Ciolli's Business and Marketing class have been working hard on recipes and researching which ingredients are USDA approved to be served in schools. The coffee shop will provide hands-on training and skills that students can take with them long after high school. Instructional areas include financial analysis, operations, marketing information management, pricing, distribution/channel management, promotion, selling and human resources management.

The Business and Marketing and Business Communications classes were added this year after a student interest survey and input from the CTE General Advisory Council was used to identify areas of need. The top results were Business and Marketing, Construction Trades and Health Sciences. W.F. West then posted teaching positions for all of these areas with the main goal being to hire the best teacher among all the applicants. Through this process Kristin Ciolli joined the Bearcat family and many students were eager to enroll in her classes. There is a large labor market need in the Southwest Washington area for people with business and marketing experience, so offering these classes matches up with the CTE program's goal to provide students with practical skills they can use in industries with high local demand.

W.F. West is partnering with Lewis County Coffee to make sure our students are trained to the highest level, just as if they were hired by LCC. Mrs. Ciolli says, "we are fortunate to have such an amazing community to support our students and grow their skills in another way through a School Based Enterprise program".

When the store opens, traditional coffee drinks and Lotus beverages that are specific to Chehalis School District will be sold. The number of days the store will be open each week is still being determined, but store hours will be before school and during both lunches.

W.F. West offers Washington State Seal of Biliteracy

In December, W.F. West offered the Seal of Biliteracy Test to all interested students for the first time. The Washington State Seal of Biliteracy was established to recognize public high school graduates who have attained a high level of proficiency in speaking, reading, listening and writing in one or more world languages in addition to English. Graduating high school students who meet the criteria will be awarded the seal on their diploma and transcript. Students are also able to earn high school foreign language credit based on their scores.

Out of 71 W.F. West students who signed up to test in December, **58 students** earned at least **2 years of foreign** language credit, and at least **17 students** will be eligible to earn the Seal of Biliteracy after completing all other English Language graduation requirements.

After receiving their test results, each student will meet with their counselor individually to go over how their scores may affect their transcript, graduation requirements, and future schedule. We are excited about the opportunity this is providing our kids, and the recognition they are getting for their language skills.








Avery Brundage & Jacobsen Bunker - French I

Career & College Readiness

- → TRADE School Tour / Feb. 7 We will be doing a college tour to Clover Park Technical College for 10th-12th grade students. This college has over 50 different programs including automotive, aviation maintenance, cosmetology, culinary arts, HVAC, web development, graphic arts, forklift certification, private pilot, dental assisting, nursing, surgical tech, early childhood education, construction technology, and many more. We really hope that students interested in trades or vocational pathways will take advantage of this trip. Permission slips are available with Mrs. Chaput and in the Counseling Center.
- → Apprenticeship Panel / Feb. 22 We will be hosting our annual Apprenticeship Panel event. We have representatives from a number of different unions and trades coming. Financial Aid Money

SENIORS! If you haven't already done so, please complete your FAFSA or WASFA as soon as possible. It is an online application at www.fafsa.gov. This year, with the increased income cut-off for the Washington College Grant, more families can now get assistance for post-secondary education. However, to be eligible for this grant and others, you must complete the FAFSA / WASFA.

If you or your families need any help in completing this form, please contact Mrs. Chaput. The FAFSA form is also required for a number of scholarships and due dates are approaching, so please do not miss this important step.

<u>2nd Semester began January 30th!</u>

Students can request changes to their electives or to be moved into a course that will meet their graduation requirements and/or post secondary plans. Parents can expect to be contacted if a change affects a student's career pathway, graduation requirements, or if a student is requesting to be moved out of an advanced class.

- The last day a schedule change can be requested is one week into second semester (Friday, February 3rd).
- After that, classes may only be changed with teacherand administrator approval.



However, youth e-cigarette use remains a serious public health concern. E-cigarettes have been the most commonly used tobacco product among youth since 2014.

Findings suggest ongoing disparities in tobacco product use across different population groups.

Current tobacco product use was higher among:

- Non-Hispanic American Indian or Alaska
 Those reporting severe symptoms of Native (AI/AN) students
- Those identifying as lesbian, gay or bisexual
- Those identifying as transgender
- psychological distress
- Those with low family affluence
- Those with low academic achievement

About 1 million youth used any combustible tobacco product. Non-Hispanic black students reported the highest percentage of combustible tobacco product use, including cigar product use.
