The Washington State Board of Education and the Association of Washington Student Leaders is proud to announce the future addition of Castulo Gonzalez as Western Washington Student Representative on the Board. Castulo is currently a sophomore at W.F. West High School in Chehalis.

“We’re looking forward to hearing Castulo’s unique voice and ideas on the Board,” said State Board of Education Chair, Bill Kallappa. “He will be able to offer a perspective that is so valuable to the Board’s work in closing opportunity gaps and considering all students’ individual needs.”

When Castulo found this opportunity, he was motivated by his love of academics and problem solving.

“I am a driven and proud Chicano student,” said Castulo. “I am passionate about languages, dedicated to learning, and I dream of becoming an airline pilot or forester. I see this as an opportunity to be a voice for my people as well as others who can't get their voice out to people who can alter someone's future in certain ways.”

Castulo describes his passions as exploring the unknown and finding where he feels belonging. He hopes to attend Central Washington University and be the first in his family to graduate from high school and go to a 4-year university. Castulo's swearing-in is planned for the June 27-29 Board meeting in Renton. He will then join senior member, Donalda Brantley from Spokane, as one of two voting student members on the State Board.

Important Note About State Graduation Requirements

- The State of Washington has created many pathways for graduation. However, those pathways are not accessible unless students have attempted to pass (taken) the English and Math Smarter Balanced tests at least once. If they haven't taken the tests, it is imperative that you attempt the tests this Spring.
- One of the approved graduation pathways is a CTE pathway. If students have taken and not passed the Smarter Balanced test, their counselor most likely has established a CTE pathway through classes they have taken/are taking. For this reason, students should make sure to pass all their elective/CTE courses.
- Dual Credit is another graduation pathway. If they have taken and not passed the Smarter Balanced test, and instead took and passed a College in the High School or Running Start English or Math course, their graduation requirement can be met that way.

**All these graduation options only apply
if they have attempted the Smarter Balanced test.**

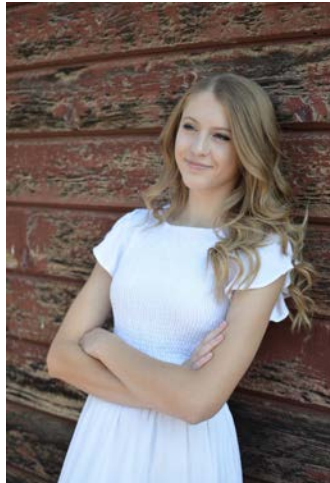

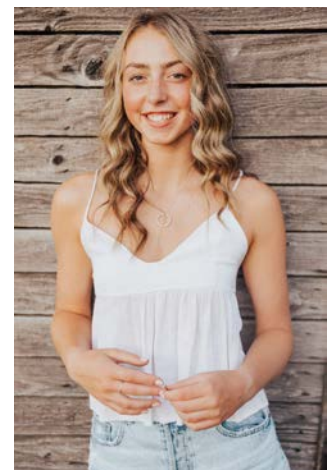

Special things to remember:

- All students in the graduation ceremony will dress alike. The only ornamentation allowed will be class stoles, medals and honor cords officially issued by W.F. West High School, **Students may not wear or carry flowers!** If your student receives flowers, they will be left in the dressing area and it may be difficult to retrieve them in the after-graduation confusion. **No decorating of hats allowed!**
- All seniors are expected to behave in a courteous and proper fashion as usual. Proper dress is required (long pants for the boys). Please check with Mrs. Williams or Mr. Walters if you have any questions. All rules and regulations for attendance at this school apply through the graduation ceremony. Please make every effort to positively maintain your, and the school's reputation. Any drinking of alcoholic beverages or use of illegal drugs will result in suspension from all activities, school, and Commencement.
- There are no reserved seats for graduation, we will have a large section of chairs on the track for relatives that are handicapped, or incapable of sitting in the stadium bleachers. Please call the main office for more information: 360-807-7235.
- Graduation will be in Bearcat Stadium. At this time we are not limiting the number of guests per student. If we have extreme weather conditions we may need to move into the gym. The commons will be open for viewing of the graduation ceremony through the live streaming option.
- Stadium seating is available on a first come basis. We ask that you are seated at least 5 minutes before the start of the graduation ceremony. PLEASE NOTE that no one will be allowed entrance into the stadium while the students are processing to their seats. Graduation will start promptly at 6:00pm.
- Reminder to all families attending graduation: this ceremony is a very special time for our seniors, their families and our community. We realize that this is a time for personal celebration, but we ask that your celebrating not take away from the enjoyment of this dignified and special occasion. We ask that you wait until after the ceremony to "celebrate". Noise-making instruments such as air horns are **not allowed**. Thank you for your cooperation in making this one of the best graduation ceremonies in Lewis County.
- Senior Skip Day does not exist, and should such an event occur, all involved will be treated as truants and Senior Week Activities will be eliminated for those students.
- Remember that since other students and teachers will be in class the days of June 12-16, we would appreciate seniors not returning to campus during this time. If you need to come back for business purposes, please check in through the office.
- **All fees and fines must be paid in the ASB office. Diplomas will be available to pick up in the counseling center June 21st & 22nd. The counseling center will be open from 7:30am - 3:30pm.**

Teen Traffic Safety

***We are approaching May, June and July, when the most fatalities occur among teen drivers.
Keep these statistics in mind and talk to your teen drivers about staying safe this summer.***



About 2,800 teens 13–19 years of age lost their lives in car crashes in 2020. That's about eight teens a day.

Motor vehicle collisions are the 2nd leading cause of death for teenagers

17% of teens admit they have ridden with a teen that had been drinking.

Many parents don't realize it, but a **major threat** to their teen's safety is driving or riding in a car with a teen driver.

Among drivers age 15-20 involved in fatal crashes, 9% were distracted at the time of the crash.

Inexperience, distractions, lack of seatbelt use and impaired driving contribute to teen collisions

43% of teens admit that they do not normally wear a seatbelt.

7.8% of motor vehicle fatalities involve 15-20 year olds.
