Important Note About State Graduation Requirements

- The State of Washington has created many pathways for graduation. However, those pathways are not accessible unless students have attempted to pass (taken) the English and Math Smarter Balanced tests at least once. If they haven't taken the tests, it is imperative that you attempt the tests this Spring.
- One of the approved graduation pathways is a CTE pathway. If students have taken and not passed the Smarter Balanced test, their counselor most likely has established a CTE pathway through classes they have taken/are taking. For this reason, students should make sure to pass all their elective/CTE courses.
- Dual Credit is another graduation pathway. If they have taken and not passed the Smarter Balanced test, and instead took and passed a College in the High School or Running Start English or Math course, their graduation requirement can be met that way.

All these graduation options only apply

if they have attempted the Smarter Balanced test.

Smarter Balanced Test dates/times:

Math Smarter Balanced test (seniors): April 25th and 26th Math Smarter Balanced test (juniors): April 27th and 28th English Smarter Balanced test (seniors and juniors): May 12th

Half way through 2nd Semester!

"If you always do what you've always done, you will always have what you always had!" Henry Ford

Have you ever continued to do the same thing and come up with the same results, but you'd hoped for something different? I have... and it feels like a vicious cycle. I love this quote because it reminds me that if I don't like the results I am getting, I can do something different to get something different.

I know some of our students are not liking their current academic results and I challenge them to step back and reflect on what they are currently doing to get those grades that they don't want.

My questions are:

Are you waiting until the last minute to get your work done? Are you forgetting to do the work, because you haven't taken notes on when it is due or have you forgotten to organize yourself in a way that works for you to turn in your work on time? Are you staying quiet and not asking questions? If you answered yes to any of these questions, maybe now is the time to make a change and get different results.

It is always a good idea to take time to reflect on your life. Your school/work life *and* your personal life. Sometimes it is hard to carve out time to think about yourself, but if you do, (even 10 minutes a day!) it might be one of the best things you do for yourself.

When you take time to reflect, you can learn what you want in your life and what you don't want. You can see if you are making progress or not. You can learn from your mistakes. *You can learn from yourSELF!*

Today, I challenge you to find 10 minutes to ask yourself "Is there anything I'd like to change about my grades in school?" IF yes, what is it that you are currently doing that you might need to change so you can have what you want to have?

You are the **ONLY ONE WHO CAN WORK ON YOU!** You have the power to change, but you must find out what you would like to change so you get the results you want.
