What is CCR BLOCK??

CCR Block (3rd Period) is from 9:30 - 10:00 and incorporates tasks and activities that are part of W.F. West's comprehensive high school and beyond plan. At its core the program is based on building relationships, and the idea that strong relationships and mutual respect encourage student learning, exploration, dialogue, confidence and growth. CCR Block provides a base for this support in relation to the career and college readiness goals of being aware, eligible and prepared; key to helping each student prepare for the future of their choice.

The program also takes into account current brain research which connects a student's ability for intellectual, social and emotional growth to safety, understanding the why, and connecting the dots within the big picture. The goals of the CCR Block program are to teach our students to contribute as members of the community, collaborate and work together, and develop the skills necessary to advocate for their educational needs. These strategies and skills will be focused on the individual student's understanding of what they are doing now in high school, and how that connects to their post-secondary career and college educational goals.

Finally, a multi-grade level CCR Block program will allow junior and senior students to mentor freshmen and sophomore students. These peer-to-peer relationships will build a strong school community and provide role models. The CCR Block will be thirty minutes of time daily, occurring between second and third period each day of the school week. The CCR Block program will include Naviance, FIT (Focused Instructional Time), ASB and Leadership, Counseling Support and Career and College Advising.

CCR is listed as Period 3 on schedules and for attendance.

Parking Rules and Vehicle Registration



The safety of students and staff is the primary concern behind our parking lot regulations. Driving on campus is a privilege. You may maintain that privilege by following the rules below:

<u>All students must register any vehicle that is to be driven on</u> <u>campus during schools hours each school year. Registration forms</u> <u>may be picked up in the school office.</u> One tag will be issued per student. The tag is to hang from the rear view mirror and may be transferred between registered vehicles in their name. YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE REGISTERED VEHICLE AND ARE LIABLE FOR ANY DAMAGES OR SANCTIONS CAUSED BY THE OPERATION OF THAT VEHICLE, REGARDLESS OF WHO IS DRIVING. The school district is not responsible for damage to vehicles driven or parked on the W.F. West campus.

Faculty/Staff Only parking is designated by a yellow line painted along the white stall line. No student parking is permitted in these areas.

RESERVED STUDENT PARKING is located in spots with a **White Bearcat Paw** and is first come, first served. A Reserved Parking permit may be purchased for \$20 with an ASB card or \$25 without an ASB card for the entire school year. Permits may be purchased at the ASB office. All proceeds go toward your Leadership Class.




<u>UNRESERVED STUDENT PARKING</u> is located in **any white lined only stall, without a white Bearcat Paw.** You must have a current year parking tag and be registered in the W.F. West office prior to using the parking lot.

Replacement of a lost or misplaced tag is \$5 and must be paid prior to receiving a new tag.

Parking is not permitted at anytime in marked "No Parking" areas. Vehicles parked in Fire Lanes where curbs are marked red are subject to towing. Vehicles with no visible tag, vehicles parked inappropriately, vehicles with two parking violations, or using any form of negligent, unsafe driving on campus will be subject to removal from campus as designated in the student handbook.

Recognition ad prices are determined by our school. Revenue from recognition ads helps the school create a better, more affordable yearbook.


How is the ad deadline determined?
