

National Honor Society Membership Requirements:

To qualify for NHS membership, every year students must:

- Be a sophomore, junior, or senior (membership must be current senior year to be eligible for NHS pin)
- Fill out the yearly registration form that was sent to each student's school email.
- Maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.0 throughout high school
- Pay yearly \$10 membership fee to Mrs Toynbee in the ASB office (waivers available for qualifying students)
- Complete a minimum of 50 hours of community service during high school, documented using WFW's community service form.
- Community service forms must be submitted to Mrs Rakevich in the counseling center or by email at Irakevich@chehalisschools.org by the Friday before Spring Break of their graduation year (class of 2024: March 29, 2024).
- NHS pin will not be ordered unless the student has submitted their registration form, paid the membership fee, and submitted community service hours by the deadline.
- Exceptions to the April 1st deadline cannot be made due to shipping time required for pins.

Submission of registration form will add students to the email list so they can receive notification of upcoming meetings, events, and community service opportunities. Students are responsible for checking their email and attending meetings to receive information necessary for active NHS membership. The Department of Education has just announced that the FAFSA will be open on **12/31/23**. This is a critical step to access federal, state, and institutional grants, loans, selective scholarships, and work-study programs. The website is

The 1st step is to get an FSA ID for <u>BOTH</u> the student and at least one parent. Everyone is encouraged to do this NOW, so you are ready to complete the FAFSA once it opens. The easiest way is to google 'FSA ID Log in' by then click 'Create Account'.

The FAFSA form unlocks all financial aid to help students and parents pay for college. If you have any questions, please contact Mrs. Chaput.

- 2. Once you begin, if you are not able to complete the entire application, you must still "submit" what you have completed in order to have it saved. You will then receive an email to the address you've provided. The email will contain a link for you to use to edit your application. You can make changes to your application at any time prior to 3:00 p.m. on February 28th. Once you certify that your application is complete by clicking yes, and hit the submit button one last time, you will no longer be able to make changes.
- 3. Your application is NOT complete until you also provide a copy of your resume we will provide a transcript.
- 4. Scholarship applications must be completed online by **3:00 p.m. on February 28th.**

Sick Policy Reminders for Students and Families

If an Individual has one or more of the following symptoms they should isolate at home and test for COVID-19:

- Fever greater than 100.4 F or chills
- Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
- Muscle or body aches
- New loss of taste or smell
- Cough (new, changed, or worsening)
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea, vomiting or diarrhea
- Fatigue
- Sore throat
