

Parking Rules and Vehicle Registration



The safety of students and staff is the primary concern behind our parking lot regulations. Driving on campus is a privilege. You may maintain that privilege by following the rules below:

All students must register any vehicle that is to be driven on campus during schools hours each school year. Registration forms may be picked up in the school office. One tag will be issued per student. The tag is to hang from the rear view mirror and may be transferred between registered vehicles in their name. YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE REGISTERED VEHICLE AND ARE LIABLE FOR ANY DAMAGES OR SANCTIONS CAUSED BY THE OPERATION OF THAT VEHICLE, REGARDLESS OF WHO IS DRIVING. The school district is not responsible for damage to vehicles driven or parked on the W.F. West campus.

Staff Only parking is designated by a yellow line painted along the white stall line.

No student parking is permitted in Staff parking spaces.

No student parking is permitted in designated "Visitor Parking" spaces

RESERVED STUDENT PARKING is located in spots with a White Bearcat Paw. Reserved spaces can be purchased on a first come, first served basis. A Reserved Parking permit may be purchased for \$20 with an ASB card or \$25 without an ASB card for the entire school year. Permits may be purchased at the ASB office. All proceeds go toward your Leadership Class.

<u>UNRESERVED STUDENT PARKING</u> is located in **any white lined only stall, without a white Bearcat Paw.** You must have a current year parking tag and be registered in the W.F. West office prior to using the parking lot.

Replacement of a lost or misplaced tag is \$5 and must be paid prior to receiving a new tag.

Parking is not permitted at anytime in marked "No Parking" areas. Vehicles parked in Fire Lanes where curbs are marked red are subject to towing. Vehicles with no visible tag, vehicles parked inappropriately, vehicles with two parking violations, or using any form of negligent, unsafe driving on campus will be subject to removal from campus as designated in the student handbook.





Sick Policy Reminders for Students and Families

Please keep your child home from school if he/she has:

- A temperature above 100.4 F during previous 24 hours (should be fever free without use of medication for 24 hours before returning to school)
- Vomiting or diarrhea during the prior 24 hours
- Yellow or green nasal drainage associated with sore throat, nausea or fatigue
- A persistent cough which has kept your child up at night
- Signs or symptoms of Influenza, such as body aches, chills, headache, fatigue

Please notify the school nurse if your child has an illness that is contagious, such as testing positive for Covid-19 or Influenza. This will help us detect illnesses in others sooner.



As a reminder, we value your student's safety while on our campus. The school day ends at 2:10 pm and students who are not involved in organized, extra-curricular activities, which provide supervision must leave campus. Please ensure your student has clear plans for after school to help us avoid having unsupervised students

Title I Notification

Parents can request the following information regarding instructional staff who work with their children:

- Whether or not the child's teacher has met state certification for the grades and subjects she/he is teaching.
- Whether or not the teacher is working with an emergency or conditional certificate where state certification criteria has been waived.
- The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held, including field of discipline of the certificate or degree.
- If the child receives instructional services from a paraeducator, the paraeducator's qualifications.

Student Led Conferences: March 4th & 5th

A Student-Led Conference (SLC) is required for all 9th-11th grade students and at least one parent/guardian. Students will prepare and deliver a presentation to their CCR teacher and parent during their conference. Please be sure to sign up for a conference time slot in Skyward (under the 'Conferences' tab) as soon as possible. Any student who will not be able to have a parent/guardian in attendance for their SLC must make prior arrangements with their CCR teacher.

2024-25 Registration

Registration is now open for next year's classes through your student's Skyward account. An email went out recently with instructions on how to compete this step. Following their SLC, students and parents will still need to bring their registration sheet to their counselor in the Commons. Counselors met with 9th-11th grade students in February to share registration information and parents/guardians are encouraged to look over their students' Class Registration Worksheets. Registration needs to be completed by March 8th. Anyone interested in doing Running Start next year still needs to register for classes at WFW. Running Start paperwork must be turned in to Mrs. Goble before March 29th. Students' High School and Beyond Plan (Google Form sent in an email to students) is due by March 29th and a parent/guardian signature is required.

WF West is excited to welcome alumni *Erin White*, an ESD counselor who works through True North, to our district for the remainder of the school year. Erin will be splitting her time between WF West and Chehalis MS. She will be screening students individually and working with qualifying students in a variety of groups settings including:

- Alcohol/Tobacco/Risk Education (ATOD)
- Intervention (Sessions available for kids who may be experimenting, but do not meet criteria for a substance use disorder diagnosis);
- Affected Others (Sessions for kids who are affected by a loved one using substances);
- TRAILS (Sessions focused on coping skills)

Referrals for screening with Erin can be made through your student's school counselor; if you need to contact her directly you can call 5509 and leave a voicemail. She will respond to messages within 24 hours.
