School Meals & Fees

Student Meals



At W.F. West High School (grades 9-12)



Breakfast is \$2.00 and Lunch is \$3.55 for each meal.

All K-8 students will continue to receive free meals through the C.E.P. program for the 2024-25 school year. However, 9th - 12th grades do not.

To view your student's lunch account balance, log into Family Access in [Skyward](#) and choose "Food Service" in the menu bar on the left hand side. This page gives you information on your student's balance, fees due, payments made and daily account of what your student has purchased. A payment button will take you to a portal where you can make a payment to your student's account.

Need Help Paying for School Lunch?

Eligibility for free and reduced lunch is based on family income. If you think your family qualifies, you can begin filling out forms for the current school year on August 22. If your family is eligible for free or reduced lunch, we encourage you to fill out the paperwork, even if your student attends a school where meals are provided for free because the forms can also qualify you for other assistance. Before filling out forms, check with your student's school office or the Chehalis School District Office (360-807-7200) to see if an application already exists for your family for the 2024-2025 school year. Parking / Transportation

High School Drivers

All licensed high school students who want to drive themselves to school must register their car with the ASB office prior to using the WFW parking lot. A restricted number of reserved parking spots marked with white paw prints may be reserved starting at W.F. West Readiness Days. Staff parking spots are marked with a double white/yellow line. All other spots are open on a first-come first-served basis. If the school parking lot is full, students may park on 16th Street or 19th Street.



Pick ups / drop offs are **NOT ALLOWED** in the 16th Street yellow bus zone at W.F. West

Parking Information and Regulations

The safety of students and staff is the primary concern behind our parking lot regulations.

All students must register any vehicle that is to be driven on campus during school hours. One tag will be issued per student. This tag hangs from the rear view mirror and may be transferred from vehicle to vehicle as long as the vehicles have been registered with the office. **YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY DAMAGES OR SANCTIONS CAUSED BY THE OPERATION OF THAT VEHICLE WHETHER OR NOT YOU ARE THE DRIVER.** The school district is not responsible for damage to vehicles driven or parked on this campus.

Replacement of a lost or misplaced tag will cost \$5.00 and must be paid prior to receiving a new tag.

All parking will be on a first come, first served basis in the designated areas. Where student parking is provided, vehicles are to be parked within the white lines of the individual stalls.

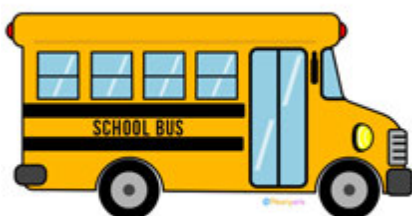
Faculty/Staff Parking is designated by a yellow line painted along the white stall line. No student parking is allowed in these parking areas.

The campus speed limit is 10 mph. Extreme caution should be exercised when crossing the speed bumps.

Vehicles with no visible tag, vehicles parked inappropriately, or vehicles with two parking violations will be subject to removal from the campus for a designated period of time. Vehicles parked in fire lanes are subject to towing. Any form of negligent driving (speeding, squealing tires, loss of control) will be treated in the same manner as above.

Driving on campus is a privilege, not a given right. Please maintain your driving privilege by cooperating with the other drivers and pedestrians. Thanks for your help!

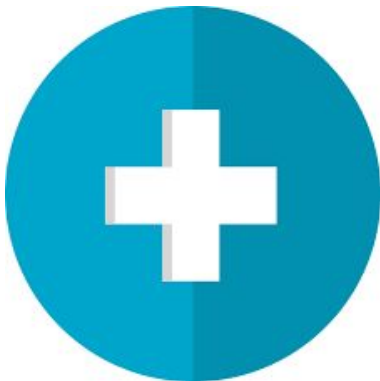

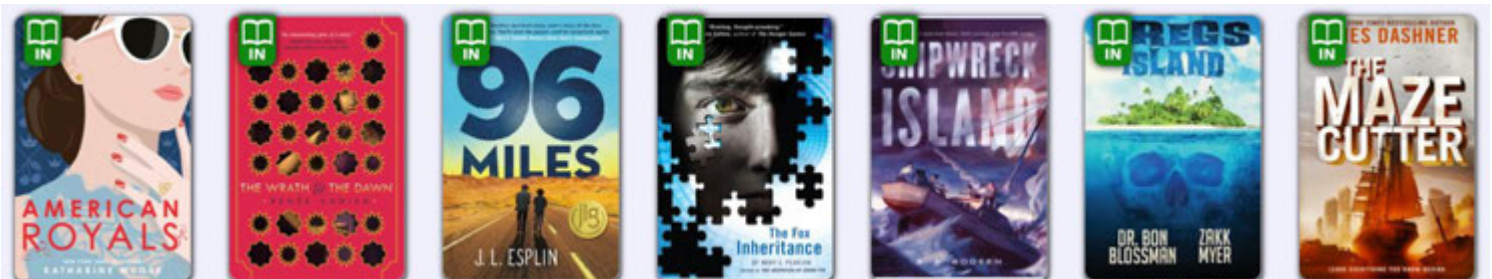

Title I Notification

Parents can request the following information regarding instructional staff who work with their children:

- The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held, including field of discipline of the certificate or degree.
- If the child receives instructional services from a paraeducator, the paraeducator's qualifications.

What is CCR BLOCK??

CCR Block (3rd Period) is from 9:30 - 10:00 and incorporates tasks and activities that are part of W.F. West's comprehensive high school and beyond plan. At its core, the program is based on building relationships and the idea that strong relationships and mutual respect encourage student learning, exploration, dialogue, confidence and growth. CCR Block provides a base for this support in relation to the career and college readiness goals of being aware, eligible and prepared; key to helping each student prepare for the future of their choice.

The program also takes into account current brain research which connects a student's ability for intellectual, social and emotional growth to safety, understanding the why, and connecting the dots within the big picture. The goals of the CCR Block program are to teach our students to contribute as members of the community, collaborate and work together, and develop the skills necessary to advocate for their educational needs. These strategies and skills will be focused on the individual student's understanding of what they are doing now in high school, and how that connects to their post-secondary career and college educational goals.

Finally, a multi-grade level CCR Block program will allow junior and senior students to mentor freshmen and sophomore students. These peer-to-peer relationships will build a strong school community and provide role models. The CCR Block program will include FIT (Focused Instructional Time), ASB and Leadership, Counseling Support and Career and College Advising.

CCR is listed as Period 3 on schedules and for attendance.
