Hey Parents... Let's Work Together!

At W.F. West we are encouraging students to develop social skills, focus on learning and academics, and be present with their school community. Along with limiting disruptions in class, these are some of the primary reasons behind our 'no cell phone' policy during class time (*with some very specific exceptions for academic use*).

Please help support this effort by only calling or texting your student during non-instructional time.

We know there are times you need to contact your child during the school day. Here are two easy ways to do so:



Call the main office to relay messages. If your message is urgent or time-sensitive, a staff member will make sure your child is notified immediately.

Washington State Seal of Biliteracy Test <u>December 3rd</u>

The Washington State Seal of Biliteracy was established to recognize public high school graduates who have attained a high level of proficiency in speaking, reading, and writing in one or more world languages in addition to English. "Participating school districts with students eligible to receive the Seal, shall place a notation on a student's high school diploma and high school transcript indicating that the student has earned the seal." (RCW 28A.300.575 / RCW 28A.230.125)

Graduating high school students must meet the following criteria to be awarded the Seal:

- Demonstrate proficiency in English by meeting the graduation requirements in English and meeting standard on reading and writing or English language arts assessments; and
- Demonstrate proficiency in one or more world languages.

ASVAB testing will be in held the Library at 7:45 am on 10/24. Students must be in the 10th-12th grade and at least 16 years old. If you are interested in exploring career and military options, you are encouraged to participate. Sign up in the Counseling Center.

October 15th is a special day at W.F. West! Regular classes will not be held in the morning, but will resume after lunch for 6th and 7th period for 9th and 10th graders. On that day, each grade level will be participating in something different. Here is what's happening...

Freshmen - - - Seminar Day

9th grade students will be taking a tour of the CTE Department and getting an introduction to each CTE class available at W.F. West. This is to give them a better idea of which classes they may like to take in the future. The Class of '28 is the first to have this opportunity, and we're excited for them to learn more about what W.F. West has to offer! To finish out the morning, they will have their class photo taken and then participate in some fun activities together.

Sophomores - - - PSAT

All Sophomores will be taking the PSAT on October 15th. *Be sure to come well rested and eat a good breakfast!* Students will report to their testing room first thing in the morning and finish by lunch time. This test is administered digitally, not on paper. The digital test format is easier to take, shorter, and allows more time per question. Similar to the SAT, the PSAT has the same sections and timing, and measures the same Reading, Writing, and Math skills students learn in the classroom – knowledge and skills your child needs to succeed in college and a career. Additionally, students may meet the requirements to enter the National Merit Scholarship Program, an academic competition for recognition and scholarships. Please help us support your child by encouraging them to do their best on test day!

Please remember that spare chromebooks are limited. It is very important to come to school prepared with a fully charged chromebook and charging cord on test day!



Title I Notification

Parents can request the following information regarding instructional staff who work with their children:

• Whether or not the child's teacher has met state certification for the grades and subjects she/he is teaching.

• Whether or not the teacher is working with an emergency or conditional certificate where state certification criteria has been waived.

• The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held, including field of discipline of the certificate or degree.

• If the child receives instructional services from a paraeducator, the paraeducator's qualifications.

Conference Q&A

Q: If I want to attend conferences should I call and make an appointment?
A: No. With arena-style conferences, you come when it is convenient for you to attend. Conferences occur on a first-come, first-served basis. If one teacher has parents already waiting, simply locate another teacher who is free.

Q: I want to attend a conference with one teacher. Do I have to go through a "big process" to accomplish that?
A: If you want to spend the minimum amount of time conferencing, we suggest that you come at the very beginning or end of the conference session.

Q: I don't want to attend any conferences, but I do want to receive a progress report for my student.

A: Call the Counseling Center at 807-7235, Ext. 5514. The staff can help you with your request.

Q: I will probably need to talk with one teacher for more than 10 minutes. Does the 10 minute limit mean that I can't talk longer than that?

A: We make a real effort to limit conferences to no longer than 10 minutes so other parents don't have long waits, but you may schedule a longer conference by emailing the teacher or contacting the school to schedule a time.

Q: I have a very short amount of time available. Will I have to stand in long lines?
A: We have centralized the location for all conferences in the Commons area. Because of the close proximity of this location, you can move easily between teacher conference areas. Our best estimate is that your total conference time should not exceed one and a half hours.

Q: How are arena-style conferences different from parent conferences in other schools?

A: We have no prior appointments and all teachers are located in one central area. Therefore, you can move freely between teachers. If one teacher has a longer waiting line, simply select another teacher whom you wish to talk with.

Q: I would like my student to attend parent/teacher conferences, but I would like to contact my student's teachers at some other time. What should I do?
A: Email the teacher or contact the school to set up an appointment.
