

We have scheduled two teacher conference days to give you the time to meet each teacher, discuss with each teacher your student's progress, and get the information necessary to give support and encouragement at home. We truly believe that if teachers, parents and administrators work together, our students can achieve their maximum growth.

Conferences for all teachers will be held in the high school Commons. Parents will have a very short distance to walk to meet with all teachers. This should help shorten the total amount of time needed to meet with all teachers.

Entry to parent/teacher conferences is at the Commons doors and parents will register there. Parents are urged to confer with all teachers to discuss individual progress and mutual concerns. All teachers are isolated in an open-arena type setting and are available to meet with parents on a first-come basis. No prior appointments are necessary.

Conference Q&A

Q: If I want to attend conferences should I call and make an appointment?
A: No. With arena-style conferences, you come when it is convenient for you to attend. Conferences occur on a first-come, first-served basis. If one teacher has parents already waiting, simply locate another teacher who is free.

Q: I want to attend a conference with one teacher. Do I have to go through a "big process" to accomplish that?
A: If you want to spend the minimum amount of time conferencing, we suggest that you come at the very beginning or end of the conference session.

Q: I don't want to attend any conferences, but I do want to receive a progress report for my student.

A: Call the Counseling Center at 807-7235, Ext. 5514. The staff can help you with your request.

Q: I will probably need to talk with one teacher for more than 10 minutes. Does the 10 minute limit mean that I can't talk longer than that?

A: We make a real effort to limit conferences to no longer than 10 minutes so other parents don't have long waits, but you may schedule a longer conference by emailing the teacher or contacting the school to schedule a time.

Q: I have a very short amount of time available. Will I have to stand in long lines?
A: We have centralized the location for all conferences in the Commons area. Because of the close proximity of this location, you can move easily between teacher conference areas. Our best estimate is that your total conference time should not exceed one and a half hours.

Q: How are arena-style conferences different from parent conferences in other schools?

A: We have no prior appointments and all teachers are located in one central area. Therefore, you can move freely between teachers. If one teacher has a longer waiting line, simply select another teacher whom you wish to talk with.

Q: I would like my student to attend parent/teacher conferences, but I would like to contact my student's teachers at some other time. What should I do?
A: Email the teacher or contact the school to set up an appointment.

Washington State Seal of Biliteracy (STAMP) Test December 3rd

The Washington State Seal of Biliteracy was established to recognize public high school graduates who have attained a high level of proficiency in speaking, reading, and writing in one or more world languages in addition to English. "Participating school districts with students eligible to receive the Seal, shall place a notation on a student's high school diploma and high school transcript indicating that the student has earned the seal." (RCW 28A.300.575 / RCW 28A.230.125)

Graduating high school students must meet the following criteria to be awarded the Seal:

- Demonstrate proficiency in English by meeting the graduation requirements in English and meeting standard on reading and writing or English language arts assessments; and
- Demonstrate proficiency in one or more world languages.

- → FAFSA!: The FAFSA Form is how students access all types of funding to help with educational costs. This includes colleges, universities, trade schools, and technical colleges throughout the country. The FAFSA is scheduled to open Dec. 1st. Please be watching for additional information


Milo Moody

From the Nunse's Desk

Pertussis is on the rise across the country. In Washington state the CDC (Center for Disease Control and Prevention) reports there have been 773 cases in 2024, thus far; in 2023 there were a total of 43 cases. The best way to prevent pertussis spread and infection is to get a TDaP (Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Pertussis) booster. For students, the first booster should be given at age 11 and repeated every 10 years. Adults should also have a booster every 10 years and pregnant women should get one before they deliver. In adults and older children pertussis symptoms can be hard to determine and often presents as a dry persistent cough that lingers. For infants and elderly adults, the symptoms and effects are more apparent. Please see the CDC information on <u>pertussis</u> for more information.

Oregon state is also experiencing a Measles outbreak just across the state border. Measles is covered in the MMR vaccine along with Mumps, and Rubella. It is one of the few vaccines a student must receive and very few can be given an exemption for. While there is no required booster repeat for MMR after the initial 2 doses are met it is a good idea to have titers taken or get a booster if you will be around immunocompromised populations. Vaccine reviews are completed and letters for non-compliant students have been sent. See the <u>CDC Recommended Immunization</u> Schedule for information on required vaccines for students or please call your students' school nurse.
