(Ex: above, below, behind) <input type="checkbox"/> Sorts objects by color, shape or size. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Correct pencil grip (3pt. grip) <input type="checkbox"/> Holds scissors correctly to cut simple objects. <input type="checkbox"/> Put on a coat, unzip backpack/lunchbox (may need some adult support). <input type="checkbox"/> Makes a variety of lines and shapes. <input type="checkbox"/> Jump with feet together. <input type="checkbox"/> Bounce a ball and catch it. <input type="checkbox"/> Climb stairs 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Takes turns in conversations with others. <input type="checkbox"/> Follows a two- step direction. (Ex:Please hang up your backpack and take off your coat). <input type="checkbox"/> Speaks a sentence using 5 or 6 words. <input type="checkbox"/> Understands many words for different objects and can describe them. <input type="checkbox"/> Use a picture to tell a detailed story. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Read to your child daily. <input type="checkbox"/> Identify if two words rhyme (Ex: cat, hat) <input type="checkbox"/> Write some letters correctly, especially those in his/her own name. <input type="checkbox"/> Identify many letters in the alphabet and the sounds letters make, especially those in his/her own name. <input type="checkbox"/> Listens and stays engaged in a story being read. <input type="checkbox"/> Hold a book correctly (right side up) and turn pages 1 page at a time. <input type="checkbox"/> Retell a story from a favorite book or own personal story. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Shares and takes turns with others. <input type="checkbox"/> Separates from caregiver without getting upset <input type="checkbox"/> Can express basic emotions. (Ex: happy, sad, mad, scared) <input type="checkbox"/> Work and play with peers. <input type="checkbox"/> Identify similarities and differences in self and others. <input type="checkbox"/> Is aware of behavior and can follow basic safety rules and routines. <input type="checkbox"/> Solve small problems- start identifying ways to solve small problems and come up with solutions. (may take multiple attempts, may ask for adult help) <input type="checkbox"/> Enjoys pretend play (Ex: talking on pretend phone, playing in a play kitchen, driving trucks).

			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Identify the beginning sound in word. (Ex: bat begins with /b/) <input type="checkbox"/> Write first name. Starting with a capital at the beginning and the rest lowercase letters.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Completes a task (Ex: puzzle, builds with legos) <input type="checkbox"/> Engage in memory games (Ex: matching game, what is missing game) <input type="checkbox"/> Focus and pay attention during different activities (Ex: story time, center work time) <input type="checkbox"/> Sing songs and recite nursery rhymes. <input type="checkbox"/> Is interested and adapts to new situations. <input type="checkbox"/> Identify and name the basic colors. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Takes care of personal needs (Ex: handwashing, clothing and bathroom needs) <input type="checkbox"/> Can express own needs (Ex: "I'm hungry", "I'm sick") <input type="checkbox"/> Knows and can say their first and last name, and age. <input type="checkbox"/> Asks questions about the world around them.
