








High School Graduation Rates: W.F. West and Washington State




Definition of Terms

- •Enrolled: Students registered and attended classes at Centralia College.




Majority of the Students Were Admitted to Centralia College

By HS Graduating Class






71% of Students Admitted Enrolled





40% of Students Enrolled Post High School














81% of <u>Post</u> HS Students Who Enrolled in College-Level Math Successfully Completed with a 2.0 Decimal Grade or Higher

By HS Graduating Class






73% of <u>Post</u> HS Students Who Enrolled in College-Level Communication Successfully Completed with a 2.0 Decimal Grade or Higher




32% of <u>Post</u> HS Students Completed a Credential (Degree or Certificate)

By HS Graduating Class






Success Outcome for <u>Post</u> HS Students

Budget Adjustments



- Because of SB 5048, CiHS is now free for all public school students.
- We have a line item in our budget for College Level Courses/College Prep Assessments for \$50,000
- To be transparent we would like to change it to College Level Course Support/College Prep Assessments
- In 23-24, we would like to use \$30,000 to support college level courses, \$15,000 for College Prep Assessments, and move \$5,000 to the Data Review (BERC) line item
- Starting in 24-25, we propose for the College Level Course Support/College Prep Assessments budget be \$30,000, adding \$5000 to Data Review, and adding \$15,000 to PK-12 Math Achievement
- Starting in 23-24, \$25,000 for four years for the purpose of working with consultants
- Disbursement Moved to August starting in August of 2024
