First Amendment Auditors

First Amendment Auditors are citizens who take it upon themselves to check that government agencies are complying with laws regarding public records and public space.

Here's what to know if a First Amendment Auditor visits your office:

- They may wear masks, sunglasses and hoods to obscure their identity. This can be alarming but is not illegal.
- They usually will not divulge their name and they are not required to do so
- They may walk around and take pictures or recordings. They are usually well-versed
 in the laws and will not go anywhere where they cannot record such as: where a
 "reasonable expectation of privacy" is present such as a shut or locked gate or door or
 signage indicating no public access; or where students are present.
- Best practices would be to answer their questions politely as we would for anyone else who visited and ignore their camera.
- They may ask your name and title, which is public information and should be provided
- They usually ask for a Public Records Request Form, which can be found on our website under "Forms" https://chehalisschools.org/forms/.
